- You must use Javadoc starting now!

A brief overview of command-line tools

- javac FILE.java - creates FILE.class
- java FILE - Runs FILE.class, which better have a main
- jar - Create an archive (may not be the exact command)
- javadoc - Generate documentation
- junit - Run unit tests (doesn't always work as expected)

Issue: Where does it look for the .java and .class files?

- Directory structure: Foo.java in edu.grinnell.csc207.samr needs to be in the directory edu/grinnell/csc207/samr
- For ease of searching, the parent directory needs to be in your CLASSPATH environment variable
